

The New Bremen Local Board of Education met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. in the Dianne Komminsk Center for Innovative Thinking.

Roll Call: Mrs. Michele Bambauer, Mr. Scott Bertke, Mrs. Shelly Busse, Mr. Cory Suchland, and Mrs. Suzanne Wells. Also attending the meeting were Superintendent Jason Schrader, K-6 Principal Diane Kramer, 7-12 Principal Marcus Overman, and Treasurer Jill Ahlers.

President Suzanne Wells led the Pledge of Allegiance.

K-6 Principal, Diane Kramer, submitted the following report:

1. Continuous improvement

- The elementary math teachers are continuing to preview various math textbooks series for implementation for the 2021-2022 school year. At our next collaboration meeting, we will decide if we are continuing with our current series for one more year or piloting a new series.
- Through math meetings we determined students need to improve automaticity of knowing basic math facts. We are planning to implement Reflex Math, an online math fact program that students can utilize at both home and school.
- During the April PD day, teachers learned about the technology in the Komminsk Center and
 have been brainstorming ways they can incorporate the technology into their curriculum.
 Teachers are already planning to use the engravers for various projects, including Mother's Day
 gifts. Brian has already started engraving tumblers that will be given out at prizes for the BIY
 5K race at the end of May.

2. Instruction

- State testing for the elementary started this week. All grades 3-6 students will be completing the English Language Arts portion of the test. State math testing will begin the first week of May.
- We are in the process of finalizing summer intervention for sessions in June and July. Students in grades K-4 have been invited for a total of 18 hours.
- Fourth nine weeks interim reports will be going home April 29th.

3. School Operations, Resources and Learning Environment

- Sixty-three students were screened last week for next year's kindergarten class. I am approximating at least 63 students will be attending.
- Lego League applications are being accepted until Friday, April 23rd for students in current grades 3-7 for the 2021-2022 school year. The coaches are again hoping to have two to three teams next year.

4. Collaboration

- While sixth grade students had their Tdap and meningitis vaccinations at the end of March we invited a therapy dog and owner from Celina in to help comfort and distract students. The dog was well-received by all. We are continuing our research on therapy dogs.
- At our last staff meeting, I met with the K-6 reading teachers to discuss HB 436 also known as the dyslexia bill. Below are a few highlights of the bill:
 - o During the 2022-2023 SY, a tier one dyslexia screener (not yet released) must be administered to each student in grades K-3 and grades 4-6 if requested.
 - o Beginning with the 2023-2024 SY, a tier one dyslexia screener must be administered to each kindergarten student.



- Teachers of grades K-3 must complete a required number of PD coursework hours during the 2023-2024 and the 2024-2025 school years.
- o Beginning in the 2022-2023 SY, districts must establish a multi-sensory literacy certification process for grades K-3 teachers.
- o Results of the screening measures must be reported to ODE.
- Thank you to Cardinal Pride for supporting our teachers during Teacher Appreciation Week, May 3-7th. They will be providing lunch on Tuesday, snack cart on Thursday, and coffee and donuts on Friday.
- Plans are being finalized for the elementary BIY (Believe in Yourself Days) to be held on May 27th and 28th. The 27th will include a field day, character building sessions, and a health fair. The 28th will start with a talent show in the morning and a one-mile run for grades K-1 students and a 5K for grades 3-6 students. A special thank you to our committee of teachers and Cardinal Pride for lining up volunteers for the field day and the run.

7-12 Principal, Marcus Overman, submitted the following report:

Continuous Improvement

- Teachers cycled through the Komminsk Center during the April 1st PD day. Brian gave a great foundational understanding of what was available in our space as well as opportunities of how it can incorporated into our current curriculum. I have talked to several teachers who were amazed by the capabilities available to them and are eager to try incorporating the technology into their courses.
- Chris and I continue to work on the best way possible to utilize some of the technologies that we have available for our students. We are looking into possible changes in some of the business courses to best meet the needs of our students as we are looking at course numbers. We have a promising idea of what we want the business department to look like and have brainstormed how it could possibly work. We are in the process of figuring out how to make those classes work seamlessly together so it involved an entire process from design, development, marketing, and sales. We hope this will create a great experience for the students.

- Chris and I met with the math department during out April 1st PD day. We continued to talk about textbooks, the progression of math courses offered to our 7-12 students, and the integration of the recently developed position in the department. We will be piloting a new textbook series once testing is completed.

- Mr. Lauterbach and I met with all freshman, all sophomores, and 8th graders in Algebra I to go over the importance of the Algebra and ELA II tests as we distributed and went over graduation requirements again. There were some good questions about graduation requirements that we were glad to clear up for students. Reminder The current sophomores will be the first class to fully graduate under the Class of 2023 Requirements & Beyond.
- At our staff meeting this morning, we discussed various important dates for the remainder of the school year as well as state testing. Testing has seemed to go very smoothly over the past week and a half.
